Gain a new perspective on the world of family history. Heather Garnsey and Martyn Killion are well known within the family history world as Executive Officer and immediate Past President of the **Society of Australian Genealogists**. They were instrumental in the success of the recent Congress in Sydney in 2018. They will present four talks over the day.

- **Forty years of family history** - suitable for both beginners and more experienced researchers, it presents the challenges, pitfalls and triumphs.
- **Filling the gap in the middle** – researching down to the present generations of a family tree. DNA has seemingly given us third and fourth cousins we never we knew we had. But how do we work out where they fit in the family tree, especially when their names are unfamiliar to us? This session looks at how to track down more recent generations of a family and highlights records that give us clues about those who have lived in the more recent past.
- **Ascertaining arrivals** - This is a session on sources which can help ascertain the immigration details of ancestors. Immigration records and indexes as well as unusual sources such as Unemployment registers are covered.
- **National Archives UK Discovery** – This session looks at the collections of the National Archives in the UK and how to access their discovery catalogue and online finding aids. The website offers such more than just an online catalogue.
